# "TV or Not TV" Tour

Proctor & Bergman's extravaganza recently finished playing San Diego, Portland, Seattle, Denver, and Los Angeles. The L.A. tour was part of Columbia Records' "Week to Remember" concert series (April 29-May 5) and was filmed to be shown at Columbia's July convention in San Francisco. The film may also be used for t.v. or possibly a feature movie.

Plans have now been made for phase two of the "TV or Not TV" tour to head to the Eastern and Southern U.S. beginning in June. Cities planned are Boston, New York (at Lincoln Center), Washington D.C. (at Kennedy Center), and Atlanta. Also scheduled are concerts somewhere in Florida, New Hampshire, Canada, and Mass. I have written the tour producers and should have a complete schedule of cities and dates by the time you receive this newsletter. Some excerpts from the tour reviews:

San Diego (from S.D. Union) - "...it was a very weird evening..." "...they retain control while simulating chaos and they draw inspiration from their own era of massive media overload and canned trivia."

Seattle (from Seattle Times) - "...a memorable night of comedy." "Some of the routines..sounded like something between Groucho and Harpo." "...best bits were 'Roaming Umpire' sequences..which were very sharply written satires..."

L.A. (from Billboard) - "Procter and Bergman (late of the Firesign Theatre) moved precariously along the thin line existing between the funny and the abrasive but managed to invoke genuine laughter..."
